

## How do I find out if a journal article is available online?

Choose **Journals A – Z** from **Articles & Newspapers** on the library homepage.

- Enter the name of the journal in the box marked **periodical name**
- Click **search Harrisburg Area Community College Library Catalog**

periodical name

match exact title  
  match start of title  
  match every word in title

This is very helpful when your class syllabus contains a **citation** for an article you are required to read, but you don't know how to find the full text.

For example, if the following citation appeared as required reading in your syllabus:

Boggs, George R. "Will Community Colleges Save the Day?" Community College Journal 77 (2007): 14-17.

you would be able to determine where to find full text access to this article by searching for the **name of the journal** (periodical) as described above. Your results are shown below.

You can now follow the **Find Journal** link to access this journal through the **ProQuest** database.

Keep in mind that you will still have to search the database for the **article**.

Clicking **Find Journal** will take you to the correct database, and often to your journal within the database, but, you will still need to use information from your citation to find the **article**.
